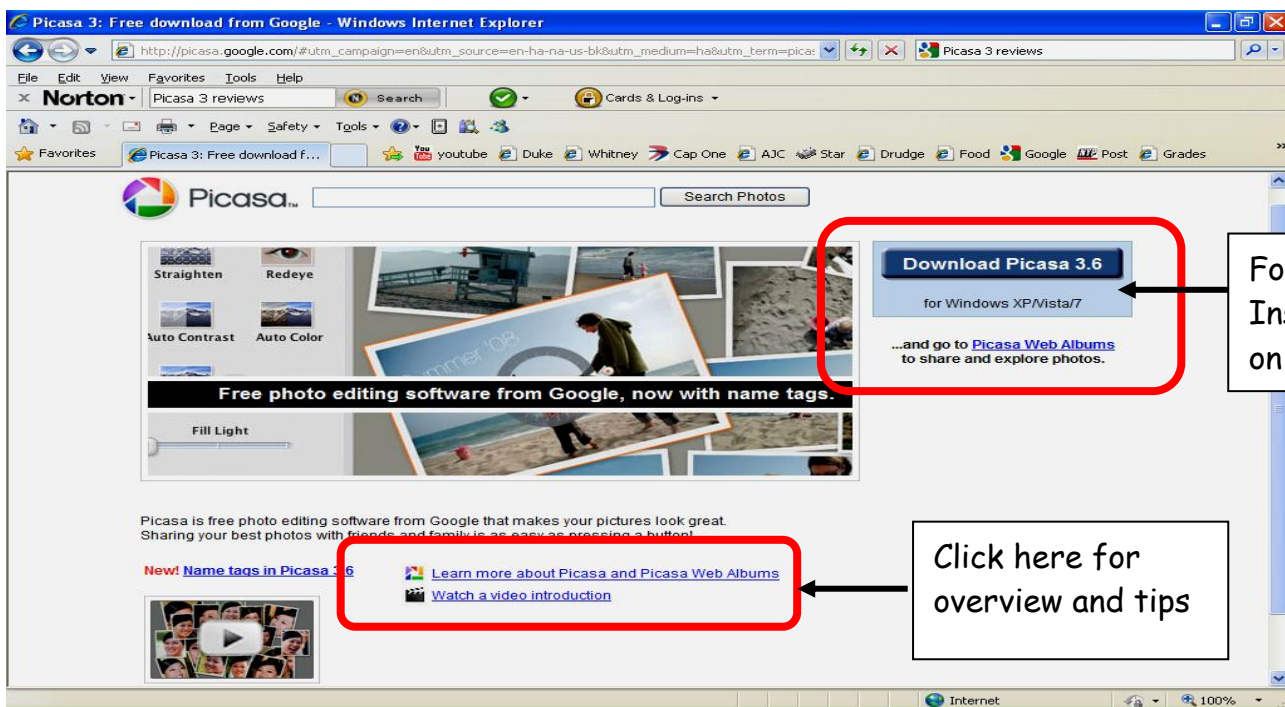

What's New in this Version

- Has improved name tags, a feature based on the same technology that powers name tags on Picasa Web Albums. With name tags, you can organize your photos based on what matters most: the people in them. In this new version, you can also upload photos to your friends' collaborative albums, more easily geotag photos using Google Maps (download "Google Earth first), and import photos from your camera and upload them to Picasa Web Albums in one step.

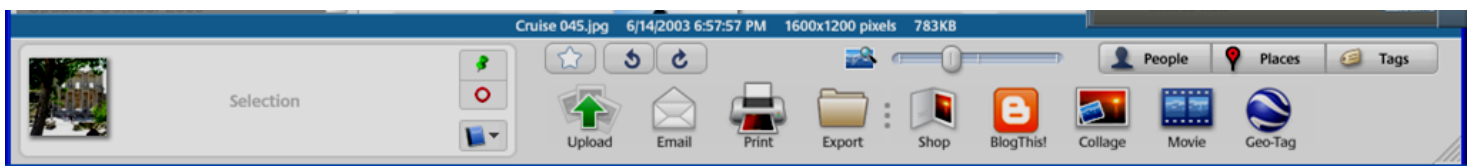
Tips for Picasa—Try It, You'll Like It!



When you open Picasa, you will note that all the pictures on your hard drive will appear in the catalog/organizer—by file name. It will put them in "The Library View".

NOTE at the bottom of the screen, you'll see a "Tool Bar" offering such options as Add a Star (mark as a favorite photo), Rotate Left or Right, Upload, E-Mail, Print, Export, Shop, Blog, collage, movie, geotag (map the photo). Under SHOP, you will be directed to a variety of online choices from which to create projects, order prints, items, etc. (To get out of the SHOP Screen, click **Back to Picasa** in the upper right corner.

The slider bar located at the bottom right of the screen adjusts the picture size from large to small, thus displaying more or less photos per screen. Your optional choice!
