SlashControl was launched in September, 2009. It has partnered with more than 30 sites to bring you lots and lots of free television shows and movies. You'll be able to access content from ABC, CBS, CW, Showtime, Hulu, A&E, The History Channel, National Geographic, Crackle and the WB, and that's just the beginning. Right now, their movie selection is drawn from Hulu and Crackle, but they'll undoubtedly be branching out and offering unique content.
